Target Audience

This program has been planned for substance abuse professionals, case managers, clinicians, social workers, psychologists, educators, health and human service practitioners and other mental health professionals.

Program Description

This day long program will improve the participants' understanding of psychotropic medications used in the treatment of numerous psychiatric disorders. Topics include the pharmacology of psychotropic medications (such as antidepressants, antipsychotics, stimulants, benzodiazepines) with a focus on dosing, adverse effects, drug monitoring, and therapeutic uses. Additionally, the role of these medications in the treatment of psychiatric disorders (such as schizophrenia, depression, bipolar, attention deficit-hyperactivity disorder (ADHD) and substance abuse) will be discussed. By the end of this program, participants should be able to apply the information they have learned in their clinical setting to improve the care of their patients.

Objectives

Upon completion of this workshop, participants will be able to:

- Identify appropriate pharmacological treatments for numerous psychiatric disorders;
- Review which psychotropic medications belong to the different medication classes;
- Describe how psychotropic medications are initiated in treatment and dosed to meet therapeutic goals; and
- Discuss common adverse effects, appropriate monitoring parameters, and drug interactions for commonly prescribed psychotropic medications.

Speaker

Andrew Muzyk, PharmD is an Associate Professor in the Department of Pharmacy Practice at Campbell University College of Pharmacy and Health Sciences in Buies Creek, North Carolina. Dr. Muzyk also holds an Adjunct Professor appointment at Duke University in the Department of Psychiatry. He teaches in the Duke School of Medicine, the Duke family medicine and psychiatry residency programs, and in the Duke Masters of Biomedical Sciences program. Dr. Muzyk has numerous funded research projects in education of health professions students in addiction and community outreach for patients with addiction. His clinical responsibilities include rounding at Duke University Hospital on the Medicine-Psychiatry inpatient service.
