

A Trauma-Informed Model of Care for Assessment and Interventions for Victims of Intimate Partner Violence

## **Target Audience**

This training will be beneficial for psychologists, clinicians, therapists, counselors, social workers, marriage and family therapists, substance abuse counselors, and all others interested in a trauma-informed model of care for victims of intimate partner violence.

## **Program Description**

The purpose of this training will be to discuss issues related to assessment of and intervention with victims of intimate partner violence (IPV). For many providers, IPV victims are a particularly challenging population to work with given their secrecy and tendency to be ambivalent about treatment. IPV victims often hope to stay in the abusive relationship and may want to protect their abuser from any negative outcomes, presenting clinicians with complex decisions regarding treatment goals and focus of intervention. This training will provide instruction in best practices for assessment of IPV, as well as provide an overview of important treatment targets, emphasizing the development of a shift from crisis intervention to psychotherapy. A framework for understanding the dynamics of IPV will be discussed, highlighting current understandings of why individuals often stay in or return to IPV relationships. A trauma-informed model of care will be emphasized as a way of empowering victims of intimate partner violence. Issues related to special populations, such as LGBTQ population and individuals who struggle with substance use disorders, will also be reviewed. This training will also provide resources for screening, documentation, safety planning, and referral.

## **Objectives**

Upon completion of this workshop, participants will be able to:

- Discuss how behavioral learning principles can help us to understand the dynamics of intimate partner violence:
- Describe how an intimate partner violence victim's stay/leave decision-making influences clinical recommendations and factors into safety planning; and
- Describe tools for helping victims to identify and elucidate how intimate partner violence affects their lives.

# Speaker

**Noga Zerubavel, Ph.D.**, is a licensed psychologist and Assistant Professor in the Department of Psychiatry and Behavioral Sciences at Duke University Medical Center. Dr. Zerubavel is the Director of the Stress, Trauma, and Recovery Treatment Clinic (START Clinic) at Duke, which provides treatment for trauma-related disorders including PTSD, dissociative disorders, and other sequelae of trauma. She specializes in working with individuals who have experienced interpersonal victimization, including intimate partner violence and sexual trauma. She also works with individuals with mood, anxiety, substance use, eating disorders, and personality disorders in the Cognitive Behavioral Research & Treatment Program and the Duke Center for Eating Disorders. Dr. Zerubavel has clinical expertise in cognitive behavioral and mindfulness-based approaches to psychotherapy, including dialectical behavioral therapy (DBT) and mindfulness-based cognitive therapy (MBCT), and supervises psychiatry residents and clinical psychology interns and fellows in these approaches.
