Target Audience

Clinicians, case managers, social workers, counselors, psychiatrists, psychologists, educators, advocates, health and human service practitioners. This program is designed for all level of human service professionals working with either primary mental health or primary substance abuse populations, considering that symptoms related to both occur simultaneously.

Program Description

This workshop will explore ethical dilemmas related to the power differential between helping professionals and their clients. While we aspire to the core values of service, social justice, dignity, and self-determination, we all too often find ourselves part of systems that disempower our clients. Through presentation and dialogue, the presenter will examine the concepts of professional privilege, the replication of trauma, and strategies for advocacy and alliance.

Objectives

Upon completion of this workshop, participants will be able to:

- Define professional privilege through the lens of social justice;
- Describe potential misuses of professional privilege and the impact of such misuse on service recipients;
- Explain dynamics of helping institutions that can reinforce the misuse of professional privilege; and
- List strategies for effectively confronting and resolving such negative dynamics on individual practice and system levels.

Speaker

Laurie Selz-Campbell, MSW, CPRP, is a clinical assistant professor at the UNC-Chapel Hill School of Social Work, specializing in the areas of severe and persistent mental illness, mental health recovery, and peer support. Ms. Selz-Campbell has won multiple teaching awards and was recently inducted into the UNC Frank Porter Graham Honor Society in recognition of her outstanding service to the University and community. Through her work in mental health peer support and her teaching on stigma and oppression, she has developed a strong interest in the ways in which professional privilege can promote – or thwart – ethical and socially-just practice.
