

PGY1 PHARMACY RESIDENCY ACUTE CARE TRACK PROGRAM OVERVIEW



Cape Fear Valley Health System in affiliation with Southern Regional Area Health Education Center

PROGRAM PURPOSE

PGY1 pharmacy residency programs build on Doctor of Pharmacy (Pharm.D.) education and outcomes to contribute to the development of clinical pharmacists responsible for medication-related care of patients with a wide range of conditions, eligible for board certification, and eligible for postgraduate year two (PGY2) pharmacy residency training.

ROTATIONS

The majority of inpatient clinical rotations will take place through Cape Fear Valley Health System. The Ambulatory Care Rotations take place at SR-AHEC. Partnerships with other regional healthcare institutions are also possible, based on the resident's interests.

SERVICE COMPONENT

A PGY1 resident will work as staff at Cape Fear Valley Health System in the inpatient pharmacy every third weekend. Additionally, the resident will work in the inpatient pharmacy intermittently throughout the residency. The resident will receive time off to compensate for this service component. The resident is also required to provide volunteer pharmacy services at The CARE Clinic (a free health clinic) one evening per month.

TEACHING OPPORTUNITIES

During the Cape Fear Valley/SR-AHEC residency, the resident will serve as a co-preceptor for pharmacy students from the University of North Carolina at Chapel Hill, Campbell University and Wingate University Schools of Pharmacy. The resident also has opportunities to teach a variety of healthcare professionals (pharmacists, physicians, medical residents, nurses) at other venues (i.e. staff education seminars, noon conference, continuing education programs). The PGY1 resident will attend seminars to earn a teaching certificate in collaboration with Fayetteville State University.

RESEARCH COMPONENT

The resident will design and complete a practice-related project under the guidance of a project preceptor. Project results are to be presented at the Southeastern Residency Conference or a comparable conference held in the spring.

OTHER OPPORTUNITIES

The Cape Fear Valley/SR-AHEC PGY1 resident will serve as an instructor in the PY1 Foundations of Patient Care Labs at the University of North Carolina Eshelman School of Pharmacy in Chapel Hill. The resident will facilitate lab activities to include problem solving, IV admixture training, and device demonstrations. The resident will evaluate and provide feedback to the students regarding achievement of core competencies.

COMPENSATION

The salary for the Cape Fear Valley/SR-AHEC PGY1 resident is competitive. The resident will receive medical and dental benefits through Cape Fear Valley at an affordable cost. The Cape Fear Valley/SR-AHEC PGY1 resident receives 10 days of personal time, 10 days for AHEC holidays and 6 days for travel to local, state and national conferences. The resident also receives a professional fund to help cover expenses to the North Carolina Association of Pharmacists Annual Convention, ASHP Midyear Meeting or equivalent national pharmacy meeting, Southeastern Residency Conference or equivalent, and other meetings.

APPLICATION PROCESS

To apply for the residency, please submit application materials through PhORCAS by **December 30, 2016**. Information regarding supplemental application materials to be submitted can be found on our website, www.southernregionalahec.org/pharmacyresidency. Candidates will be notified of an offer for an on-site interview by the middle of February 2017.

2017 APPLICATION REQUIREMENTS

References

1. Candidates must submit recommendations from at least three references.
2. At least two recommendations must be written by APPE preceptors.
3. References must complete the standard form in PhORCAS.
4. References should provide written comments on applicant's characteristics in the PhORCAS reference area.
5. References must also complete the Narrative Comments section in the PhORCAS reference area.
6. Our program will only accept recommendation letters through PhORCAS.

Letter of Intent

1. At a minimum, the letter of intent must address all of the following:
 - Short-term goals
 - Long-term goals
 - What the candidate can bring to the CFV/SR-AHEC Pharmacy Residency program and how the residency can help the candidate achieve his or her goals.
 - Plans after completing the PGY1 residency program, to include potentially staying in our region of North Carolina.
