

Planning and Preparing for the Substance Abuse Professionals' Written Credentialing Exam

Target Audience

This program has been planned for psychologists, social workers, case managers, counselors, substance abuse professionals, other interested mental health providers, and all others who are preparing for the Substance Abuse Professionals' Written Credentialing Exam.

Program Description

This workshop offers participants an opportunity to improve their understanding of the written examination process required by the North Carolina Substance Abuse Professionals Practice Board (NCSAPPB) for credentialing, to study examples of The International Certification and Reciprocity Consortium/Alcohol and Other Drug Abuse, Inc. (ICRC/AODA) written examination, to explore test taking strategies, and to demonstrate the relationship between the five performance domains and The 12 Core Functions, and TAP. Furthermore, the participants will be provided resources and aids to prepare for the test, as well as the opportunity to develop a personal study plan.

Objectives

Upon completion of this workshop, participants will be able to:

- Identify the primary purpose for the examination/credentialing process;
- Identify the five performance domains and their relationship to The 12 Core Functions;
- Review and explore representative questions used on the ICRC/AODA Written Exam;
- Study various test taking strategies and identify available resources and aids that may assist in increasing personal and professional knowledge levels; and
- Develop a personal plan for studying and taking the written examination.

Speaker

Jim Mallinson, MA, CCAS, has more than 30 years of experience as a clinician and administrator in substance abuse treatment both in the community and on the college campus. Mr. Mallinson has taught courses on addictive disease, certification preparation, ethics, and healthcare management at various institutes throughout the region including the North Carolina Foundation for Alcohol and Drug Studies and the Duke Addictions Program. Mr. Mallinson provides counseling services, clinical supervision, and consultation services through his practice Carolina Counseling Services in Salisbury, NC. He is on staff in the Department of Psychiatry and Behavioral Health at Wake Forest university health Services, and he serves as a faculty member at Catawba College in Salisbury. Mr. Mallinson is a NCSAPPB Licensed Clinical Addictions Specialist and Certified Clinical Supervisor, and a NAADAC certified Master Addiction Counselor.
