Program Description

According to NC DHHS and the CDC, North Carolina has experienced a 350% increase in drug overdose deaths since 1999, and was one of 19 states that saw statistically significant increase in drug overdose death rates from 2014 to 2015. Prescribing practices for opioids must change in order to address this epidemic. This education activity will fulfill the controlled substances CME requirement for the North Carolina Medical Board (2 hours).

Objectives

- Discuss best practices for prescribing controlled substances for chronic pain.
- Promote best practices for managing chronic pain.
- Review the behavioral aspects of chronic pain and how to differentiate between uncontrolled pain and the symptoms of misuse/abuse/addiction.
- Describe strategies for communicating with patients about avoiding or reducing prescription opioids.

Speakers

Robert "Chuck" Rich, Jr., MD, FAAFP, serves as medical director for Community Care of the Lower Cape Fear, 1 of the 14 North Carolina Medicaid regional networks. In that capacity, he has served as a practice educator on safe opioid prescribing and quality improvement activities as well as a practice and patient advocate for quality metrics. He also serves as a part-time clinician and practice medical director of a facility-owned group practice serving a rural population in southeastern North Carolina.

Ken Fleishman, MD, is the medical director of Behavioral Healthcare and Chief of Psychiatry at Cape Fear Valley Hospital. He is board certified and re-certified in child, adolescent and adult psychiatry. His clinical responsibilities include providing care in the adult inpatient unit, emergency department and outpatient clinic. His outpatient clinic focus includes Child and Adolescent Psychiatric Illness, Autism Spectrum Disorders and Medication Assisted Treatment for Substance Abuse. He is on the clinical faculty at the Jerry M. Wallace School of Osteopathic Medicine. Previously he was Medical Director at Laurel Heights Hospital in Atlanta, Georgia, where he also served as a clinical faculty member in the Department of Psychiatry at the Emory School of Medicine and Morehouse School of Medicine.
