Program Description

This activity will update participants on new drugs that have recently entered the U.S. market. In addition, possessing pharmacy law is imperative for every practicing pharmacist and technician. Several important changes to North Carolina and federal law have been implemented and will be reviewed in this knowledge-based continuing education.

Objectives

Upon completion of this knowledge-based course, the participant will be able to:

- Identify new agents that have recently entered the U.S. market and are significant pharmacotherapeutic advances.
- Describe the mechanism(s) of action of these agents, typical dose(s) used, common adverse reactions and/or contraindications associated with their use
- Discuss appropriate use of these new agents, comparing them with older agents used for the same indications.
- List special patient instructions and/or monitoring parameters required with the use of these agents
- Describe recent changes in rules that affect the practice of pharmacy
- Review aspects of pharmacy law that affect dispensing.
- Explain recent statutory changes, federal and state, that affect the practice of pharmacy
- Explore various legal “hot topics” affecting the practice of pharmacy, and, in particular, Board of Pharmacy disciplinary emphasis points.

Thomas R. Thutt, RPh, BS, serves as an Adjunct Assistant Professor at the UNC School of Pharmacy and is the founder of the NC Multistate Pharmacy Jurisprudence Examination.

Scott Perkins, PharmD, is a Clinical Assistant Professor and Co-director of Drug Information at Campbell University College of Pharmacy & Health Sciences.
