Subject: Southern Regional AHEC CTC Equipment Maintenance and Decontamination Policy

- 1. Decontamination Guidelines are adapted from
  - a. Manufacturer Recommendations
  - b. Healthcare Infection Control Practices Advisory (link to full guidelines)
- 2. Disinfecting solutions
  - a. Manufacturer Recommendations
    - i. Laerdal (link to full guidelines)
      - 1. Disinfecting wipes
      - 2. Products with kerosene or fossil fuels not recommended
    - ii. Prestan (link to full guidelines)
      - 1. Disinfecting wipes
      - 2. ¼ cup bleach with 1 gallon water for 10 minutes
  - b. HICPAC Guidelines
    - i. 500 ppm available chlorine for 10 minutes
    - ii. Alcohols are not recommended
- 3. Timeline
  - a. Equipment should be decontaminated between uses if shared
  - b. Equipment should be decontaminated after class and before storing
- 4. Cleaning process
  - a. Manikins
    - i. If possible, have each student use their own manikin and face mask
    - ii. If students share manikins or face masks, clean them in between uses
    - iii. Remove and wash clothing
    - iv. Disassemble manikin per manufacturer instructions
    - v. Dispose of lungs (if applicable)
    - vi. Inspect equipment for cracks or tears, replace as needed
    - vii. Disinfect all surfaces, inside and outside, with a disinfecting solution listed above
    - viii. Ensure manikin is completely dry before assembling and storing
  - b. Equipment
    - i. Do not reuse disposable equipment
      - 1. One-way valves
      - 2. Bandages
      - 3. Plastic manikin lungs
    - ii. Disinfect all used equipment with a disinfecting solution listed above
      - 1. BVMs
      - Pocket Masks
      - 3. Epi Trainers & Medications
      - 4. Airways (adjuncts and advanced)
      - 5. AEDs and Defibrillators
      - 6. Tables and Chairs
      - 7. Any other reusable equipment used in high fidelity training
- 5. Storage
  - a. Ensure all equipment is dry before storing
  - b. Stacking manikins may damage the nose of some models
  - c. In some models, removing the head from the torso will provide extra protection
  - d. Remove batteries if equipment will be stored for an extended period
